By His Excellency the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by the *Defence Act* 1903-1941 and of all other powers me thereto enabling, I, Alexander Gore Arkwright, Baron Gowrie, the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby delegate to every officer of the Military Forces who shall at any time during the continuance of this delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of Commander, 4th Australian Armoured Brigade, the following powers namely:—

- (a) the power to convene district courts-martial;
- (b) the power to appoint officers to constitute district courts-martial;
- (c) the power to confirm the finding, or finding and sentence of any district court-martial, or to send back the finding and sentence or either of them for revision;
- (d) the power to mitigate or remit the punishment or any part of the punishment awarded by any sentence or to commute the punishment for any less punishment to which the offender might have been sentenced by the court-martial; and
- (e) the power to suspend the execution or currency of any sentence on such terms and conditions (if any) as he thinks fit.

By His Excellency the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by the *Defence Act* 1903-1941, and of all other powers me thereto enabling, I, Alexander Gore Arkwright, Baron Gowrie, the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby delegate to every officer of the Military Forces (not being below the rank of Colonel) who shall at any time during the continuance of this delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of Commander, North Eastern Training Centre, Commander, Southern Training Centre, Commander, Western Training Centre, or Commander, Australian Armoured Corps Training Centre, the following powers namely:—

- (a) the power to convene courts-martial;
- (b) the power to appoint officers to constitute courts-martial;
- (c) the power to confirm the finding, or finding and sentence of any court-martial (other than, in the case of an officer, a sentence of death or a sentence of penal servitude or imprisonment, or to be cashiered or dismissed from His Majesty's Service or from the Defence Force, or in the case of a soldier, a sentence of death or a sentence of penal servitude or imprisonment exceeding a term of two years), or to send back the finding and sentence or either of them for revision;
- (d) the power to mitigate or remit the punishment or any part of the punishment awarded by any sentence, or to commute the punishment for any less punishment to which the offender might have been sentenced by the court-martial; and
- (e) the power to suspend the execution or currency of any sentence on such terms and conditions (if any) as he thinks fit.

WHEREAS by regulation 3 of the National Security (Subversive Associations) Regulations it is provided that any body corporate or unincorporate, the existence of which the Governor-General, by order published in the *Gazette*, declares to be in his opinion prejudicial to the defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war, is thereby declared to be unlawful;

And whereas, by order published in the *Gazette* on the fifteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, the existence of certain bodies, including The Communist Party of Australia, was declared to be prejudicial to the defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war:

And whereas it is desirable that so much of the said order as relates to The Communist Party of Australia be revoked:

Now therefore I, Alexander Gore Arkwright, Baron Gowrie, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *National Security Act 1939-1940*, the National Security (Subversive Associations) Regulations and all other powers me thereto enabling, do hereby revoke so much of the said Order as relates to The Communist Party of Australia:
